Founded in 2003, Oasis House serves women in the Dayton region impacted by human trafficking, sexual exploitation, and substance abuse. For more than two decades, we have provided prevention, outreach, residential housing, and structured life skills programming rooted in Christ's unconditional love.

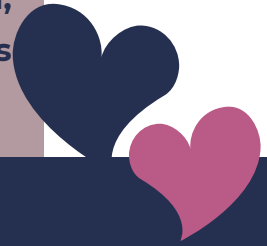
We walk with women before, during, and after exploitation, partnering with community agencies, churches, other stakeholders, and volunteers to promote healing, restoration, and long-term independence.

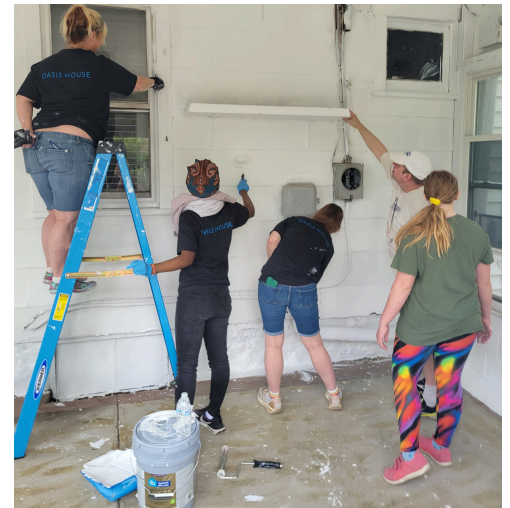
OASIS SAFE HOUSE PROGRAM

In 2025, Oasis House provided over 36,000 hours of safe housing.

Safe and stable housing forms the foundation for healing and lasting change. A secure environment provides the structure survivors need to recover from trauma, build confidence, and pursue independence.

At Oasis House, women live in a safe, well-maintained home designed to promote accountability and growth. Staff provide daily support, guidance, and case management to ensure safety and progress. Through life skills training, education, and vocational development, residents gain practical tools to manage responsibilities and prepare for long-term stability.

With structure and support, women move forward with strength and purpose.

PROGRAMMING

Oasis House empowers survivors through advocacy, mentoring, case management, and life skills programs. Our Women of the Roundtable Project offers evidence-based curriculums, financial literacy, creative arts, and specialized classes like boundaries, emotional management, music therapy and more.



GROUP WORK

Our group work fosters community, reduces isolation, and creates a supportive space for healing. Participants learn from each other's experiences, build healthy relationships, and develop essential life skills for growth and independence.



COMMUNITY BUILDING

True restoration extends beyond our doors. We help connect survivors with other organizations and community resources to expand their access to opportunities that foster personal growth, stability, and empowerment.



OUTDOOR ACTIVITIES

At Oasis House, we offer opportunities like walking in nature and movement-based wellness programs to promote physical and emotional well-being. These activities empower survivors by fostering resilience, self-care, and a sense of renewal.

The goal of Oasis House’s education and awareness programming is to provide the public with the most accurate and reliable information available on the subject of human trafficking. We often partner with organizations that share a similar mission to strengthen the quality and reach of this work. Preparing these presentations requires extensive research and interviews, often taking many hours to ensure the information we share is both

precise and responsible. Because of that commitment, our presentations remain in high demand. In 2025, Oasis House delivered hundreds of hours of presentations that were well received and played an important role in educating the public, professionals, and other stakeholders.

COMMUNITY OUTREACH

Oasis House meets survivors where they are. This may be through jail outreach, cyber outreach, street outreach, or through partnerships with other organizations serving vulnerable women. In 2025, we provided more than 3,400 direct services, helping ensure women received the support and resources they needed to move toward stability and independence.



CYBER

Each year, Oasis House personally connects with women experiencing online exploitation. We offer essential services along with compassionate support and a clear pathway to safety, healing, and restoration.



JAIL/PRISON

In 2025, Oasis House served incarcerated women through our jail outreach efforts. This work focuses on building relationships, offering support, and connecting women to vital resources both during their time in jail and as they transition back into the community.



STREET

For over 20 years, Oasis House street outreach has provided a lifeline to survivors by offering immediate support, safety, and hope. Through building trust, we connect women to resources that support healing and long term recovery.



COMMUNITY LEADERSHIP

In January 2025, Oasis House hosted the Southwest Ohio Human Trafficking Conference at Curran Place in Dayton, bringing together law enforcement, medical professionals, counselors, and community leaders to strengthen regional response efforts. Ohio Attorney General Dave Yost delivered the keynote address, reinforcing the importance of coordinated action, prevention, and victim-centered intervention. The conference provided expert sessions on trafficking essentials, domestic child sex trafficking prevention, medical assessment tools, illegal massage businesses, and survivor testimony, equipping attendees with practical tools to identify, respond to, and prevent exploitation.

SAFETY & SUPPORT

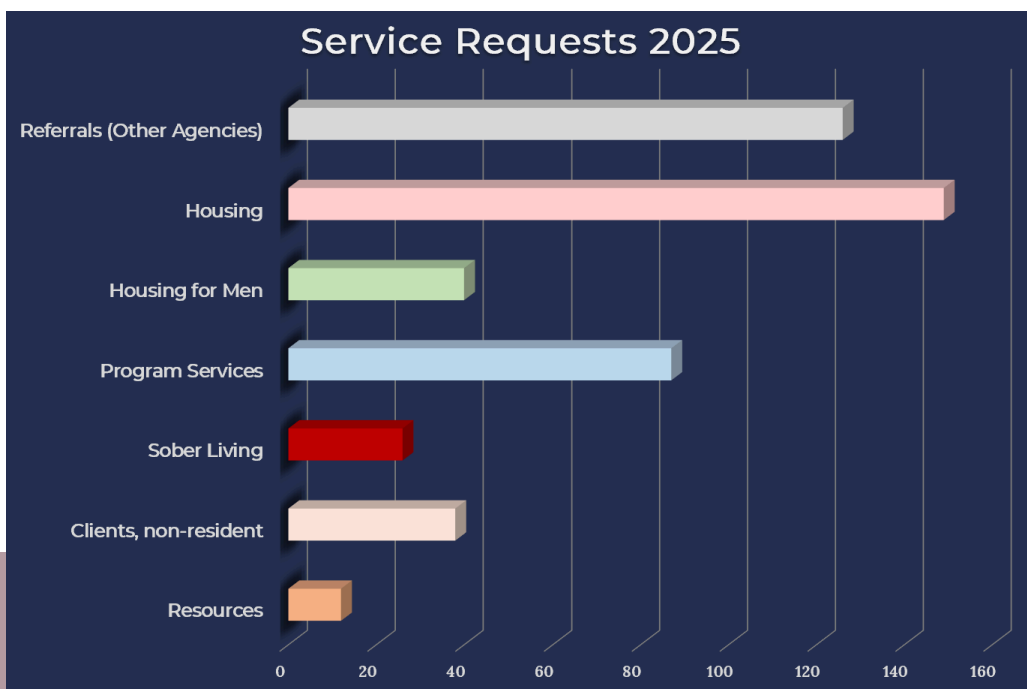
In 2025, Oasis House received more than 200 inquiries that fell outside our core mission, a reflection of the organization's broad reach and presence in the community.

Oasis House continues to see growing demand for services as more individuals and agencies turn to us for help and guidance.

In 2025, overall demand remained strong and in several areas increased. Housing requests rose significantly to around 150, reflecting the continued need for safe and stable housing for survivors. Referrals to other agencies remained high at approximately 125, demonstrating Oasis House's role as a trusted connector within the community. Program service inquiries also increased to about 90, indicating growing awareness of Oasis House programming and the value survivors find in it.

Requests for housing for men, sober living support, and services for non-resident clients also remained steady, while general resource inquiries continued to come in from individuals seeking guidance and direction.

Together, these numbers show both the growing reach of Oasis House and the trust the community places in our organization. As awareness increases, more individuals, families, and partner organizations look to Oasis House for leadership, resources, and compassionate support for those affected by exploitation and trauma.
